



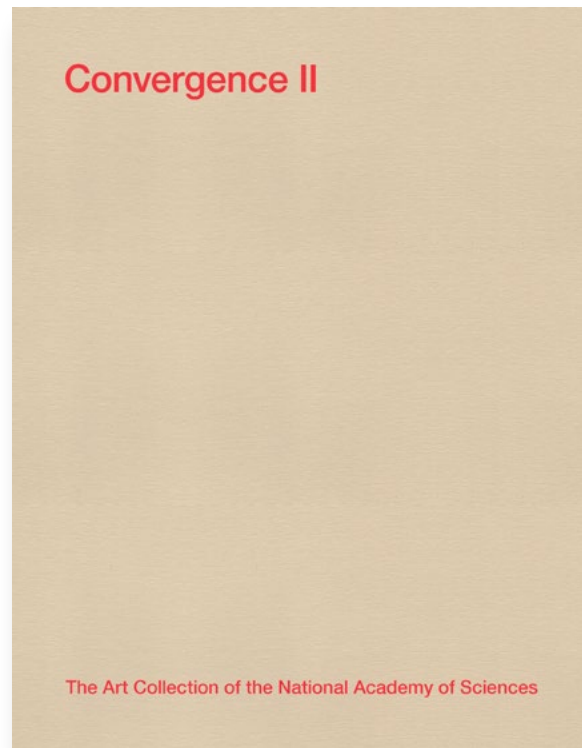
# Convergence II

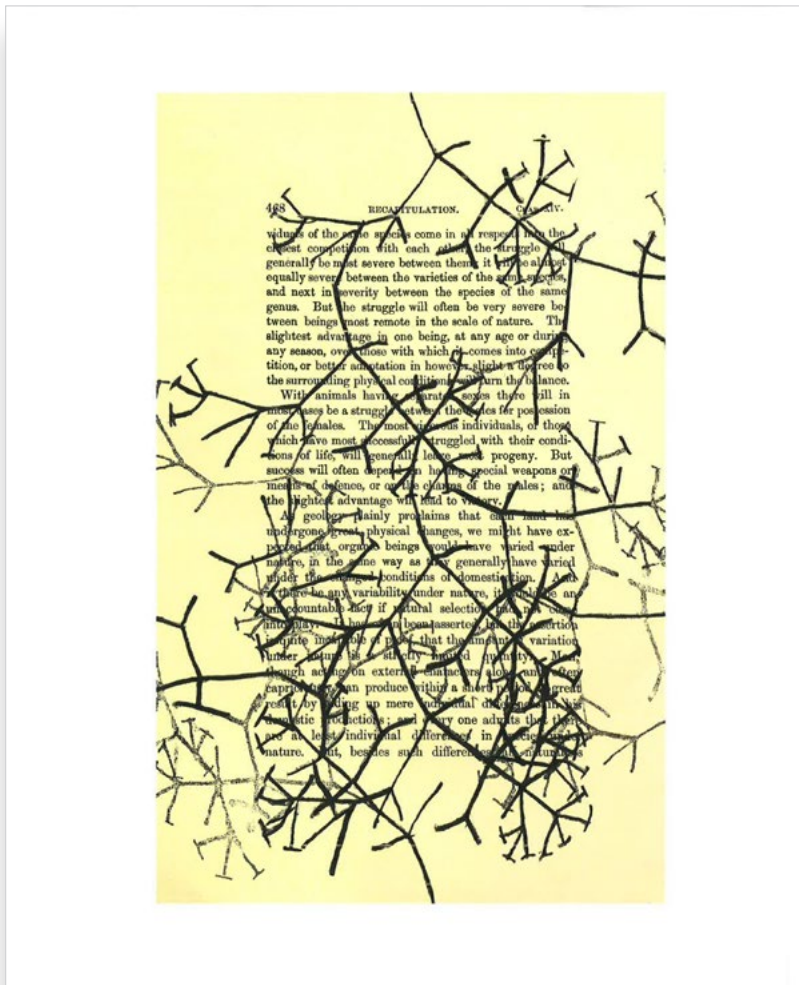

In 2009, CPNAS engaged Tim Rollins and K.O.S. to create an artwork honoring the 200th birthday of Charles Darwin and the 150th anniversary of his publication, *On the Origin of Species*. This was the first time the group had engaged with a book of science literature, illuminating the potential of art engagement as an educational tool in science. Since then, the collective has workshoped Darwin's book with students at a school in Edinburgh, Scotland and elsewhere. The original painting that initiated the series is in the collection of the NAS. This limited-edition print is derived from a study made in the creation of the original painting.
